

Occupational Therapy Assistant Program Policy on Advanced Placement Course Credit Transfer

Lackawanna College observes the recommendation of the American Council on Education in the evaluation of Advanced Placement coursework.

High school students who have taken and passed Advanced Placement courses and passed the appropriate College Board examination with a score of “3”, “4” or “5” will receive college credit for relevant courses in the college’s general education offerings. For example, if a student has taken an Advanced Placement psychology course in high school and passed the examination with the acceptable score he/she would receive credit for having taken Introduction to Psychology. This applies to all students accepted to Lackawanna College including those accepted to the Occupational Therapy Assistant Program.

The general education courses to which this policy applies are as follows:

1. ENG 105 College Writing
2. MAT College Algebra
3. PSY 105 Introduction to Psychology

If accepted to the Occupational Therapy Assistant Program, a student who has taken an Advanced Placement Course and received an acceptable score on the appropriate College Board examination in biology, anatomy and physiology and/or medical ethics (within the last 3 years) will receive college credit for the corresponding course or courses at Lackawanna College:

BIO 120 General Biology
