EMS Academy

The EMS Academy recently recertified our State DOH Accreditation for another two years as an ALS and BLS training center. The Academy has held three successful EMT courses since obtaining initial BLS accreditation last year. The next EMT class is set to start March 3 and enrollment has begun. Recruitment is going on for a Paramedic class set to start July 23, 2018. The EMS Academy is also looking to develop other programs in emergency services to support the community's needs.

Nurse Aide

The Lackawanna College Nurse Aide Training Program began in July 2006 with 60 classes completing to date. Our program is approved and accredited by the Pennsylvania Department of Education for 128 total hours: 40 didactic hours, 44 laboratory hours and 44 clinical hours at a local nursing home. Upon fulfilling all program hours and requirements, students are eligible to sit for the National Nurse Aide Assessment Program Examination administered by Credentia. This program is an excellent opportunity for the student who needs more time adjusting to the college atmosphere or to test the waters in a Certificate Allied Health Program.

Occupational Therapy Assistant

The OTA Program is a two-year program which prepares students to become Occupational Therapy Assistants. Occupational Therapy is a health profession whose goal is to enhance a person's participation in everyday activities, to promote health and wellness, and to help people achieve independence, meaning and satisfaction in all aspects of their lives. The OTA program launched its initial classes beginning Spring 2018. Granted Candidacy by their accrediting agency ACOTE, the American Council for Occupational Therapy Education, the OTA staff are currently preparing for the second stage in the accreditation process.

Physical Therapist Assistant

Lackawanna College's PTA Program is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education. It is a two-year program which prepares students to become Physical Therapist Assistants who work closely with Physical Therapists. The LC PTA Program second-year students participated in an IPE in Oct. 2017 with the third-year DPT students from the University of Scranton. In addition to learning more about working as a PT-PTA team, students of both disciplines may see some familiar faces on clinicals as all of these students will be transitioning to clinic-based education in 2018!

Sonography

The Sonography Programs at Lackawanna College are accredited by CAAHEP. Sonography (also known as ultrasound) is the use of sound waves to generate an image for the assessment and diagnosis of various medical conditions. Lackawanna College's Sonography Department offers a two-year associate degree in each of three specializations: Diagnostic Medical Sonography, Vascular Sonography and Cardiac Sonography.

Surgical Technology

The Surgical Technology program at Lackawanna College is accredited by the (CAAHEP). The accreditation is upon the recommendation of the Accreditation Review Council on Education in Surgical Technology and Surgical Assisting (ARC/STSA). The program is designed to be completed over a two-year period. In February, Program Director, Kim Norton, and Clinical Coordinator, Mary Lou Purnell, will be presenting at the National Surgical Technology Instructors Conference in Charleston, S.C.
